School Expense Reductions

Field Trips

School District U-46 and Centennial School are forced to reduce expenses just like most of America. The number and types of field trips have been reduced. Centennial students will be going on educational field trips that meet district educational guidelines. Roller skating will be out as an approved field trip. A Hemmens Cultural Center visit will be permitted as a field trip.

School Budget Reductions/Classroom Room Temperature

The State of Illinois has been unable to meet all of its financial obligations to the school district. The 2008-2009 Centennial School Budget has been reduced by 10% as of February 2009.

The district has reduced the average classroom temperature to 68%. In addition, the district has directed us to cut back on almost all overtime in the school. We are asking parents to dress their students for the change in room temperature. (The kindergarten room temperature in Mrs. Bailey's room was 69.5 degrees Feb. 23rd.)

The school district might be facing additional budget reductions this year and next year. We will keep you informed of further changes at Centennial School.

2009-2010 School Staffing

Centennial School has been given the following staffing as of February 2009:

three classes in kindergarten through fourth grade classes,
two fifth grade classes,
one five/six classroom,
three sixth grade classrooms,
and two self-contained autism classes.

We will also have a full-time speech teacher and part-time social work, O.T., and cross categorical teachers. In addition, our school building hosts offices for specialized physical education staff, a psychologist and for teachers of gifted and hearing impaired students.

Attendance and Tardies

Students need to be in school on time. School starts at 8:30am for most students. The kindergarten students start at 8:30 (AM Class) and 12 noon (PM Class. Students who are late for school will receive a warning for being tardy. If a student is late again they may face alternate lunch and recess.

ISAT Testing Information and Suggestions

The following suggestions are recommended for doing well on tests:

Be prepared for and know the material you are being tested on,

Get a good night's sleep before the test,

Eat a good breakfast,

and get a lot of encouragement.

Centennial 3rd – 6th grade students will be taking the ISAT tests March 2-13, 2009. ISAT tests are 45 minutes in length. Students are given an extra 10 minutes if they need it. Students with IEPs are allowed to have extended time as set forth in their IEPs (Individual Education Plan).
